Subject: Member Skills Demos
**Speaker: Bob Gabor, Bill Anderson,
Mike Payst, & Pete Bucki**

This type of program was so well received when it was first done in 2009, we decided to do it again in 2011. This program is about hands-on skills with members demonstrating various techniques that are used in woodworking. There will be four stations, one for each speaker, and the audience will be split into four groups that will rotate through the four stations. The splitting into small groups will give participants a great opportunity to interface with the presenters and to even try the technique.

Bob Gabor will present a demo on the glue up of panels.

Bill Anderson will present a demo on the use and sharpening of the hand scraper.

Mike Payst will give a demo on the creation and use of the lock miter joint.

Pete Bucki will give a demo on sharpening with the Work Sharp sharpening system and you may even have an opportunity to sharpen your chisels or plane irons.

This will be a great program, as these presenters are very skilled at woodworking and in the particular techniques that they will be demonstrating.

Subject: Custom Finishing
Speaker: Dexter Adams
Workshop: July meeting for details

August holds a real treat, with a program & workshop focusing on all aspects of custom finishing. Dexter has a great eye for color and is a great communicator, so this will be entertaining as well as educational.

Sign-up early, as we are expecting a full house for this program. Tuition will be \$40.00. Each participant will be provided 3 individual door panels with a material cost of approximately \$25.00.

Dexter has spent his entire career in the furniture making industry, focusing on the finishing side of the business. He had many stops along the way, ending up with the Henredon Co. in Morganton, NC, where he retired in 2007. In his work, he traveled extensively to Asia and South America consulting on materials and finishing. He formed his own consulting company in 2007, focusing on teaching and taking non-value steps out of the furniture finishing process. Dexter has an extensive collection of test panels that cover a wide range of surface preparation, as well as shading and layering, which he will use for his presentation. He has an exceptional eye which will be obvious when you see the result of his test panels. In the one day workshop, Dexter will demonstrate the process and various steps in developing a custom finish using a combination of texturing, spray and hand applied finishes. Students will be provided individual door panels for use in developing their own finish, and this will provide an excellent opportunity to express their creativity.
