Subject: Custom Finishing Speaker: Dexter Adams Workshop: August 20th (full)

August holds a real treat, with a program & workshop focusing on all aspects of custom finishing. Dexter has a great eye for color and is a great communicator, so this will be enertaining as well as educational.

As anticipated, interest has been great and we have filled all 15 slots for the Saturday workshop. But there will be plenty of seats for the Friday program, so come early to get a good one..

Dexter has spent his entire career in the furniture making industry, focusing on the finishing side of the business. He had many stops along the way, ending up with the Henredon Co. in Morganton, NC, where he retired in 2007. In his work, he traveled extensively to Asia and South America consulting on materials and finishing. He formed his own consulting company in 2007, focusing on teaching and taking non-value steps out of the furniture finishing process. Dexter has an extensive collection of test panels that cover a wide range of surface preparation, as well as shading and layering, which he will use for his presentation. He has an exceptional eye which will be obvious when you see the result of his text panels. In the one day workshop, Dexter will demonstrate the process and various steps in developing a custom finish using a combination of texturing, spray and hand applied finishes. Students

will be provided individual door panels for use in developing their own finish, and this will provide an excellent opportunity to express their creativity.

Subject: Design with a Capital "D" Speaker: Jay Speetjens

Jay will present a comprehensive program on furniture and cabinet design. This is a great opportunity to learn from one of the masters. We will see a slide show presentation of some of his work and then he'll take us through the whole process on one of the pieces shown. Points covered will be: design conception, sketches & drawings, modeling or prototyping, material selection, joinery, glue-up, special considerations, and finishing. As an added treat, Jay will bring along a couple of finished pieces for viewing and discussion.

Jay Speetjens is a professional woodworker who creates custom & original furniture as well as cabinetry. He works out of his shop in Greensboro NC which he established in 1992. He has written technique and project articles for both Woodwork Magazine and Fine Woodworking. Jay is an active member of the Piedmont Japanese Carpentry Club and a co-founder of Two Pines Trading Co., which is a web-store dedicated to expanding the knowledge and use of Japanese woodworking tools.

Bob Gabor presented a demo on the glue up of panels; Bill Anderson presented on the use and sharpening of the hand scraper; Mike Payst gave on the creation and use of the lock miter joint; and Pete Bucki on sharpening with the Work Sharp sharpening system.

At our last meeting, we recognized Joe Gorman for his help in a wide variety of areas. He acts as Secretary when Bill Anderson is unavailable, assists in mailing the newsletter, coordinates materials for Toys for Tots workshops, and a variety of other tasks.
