### Topic: Functional and Semi-functional Ironwood Art

I have been creating functional and semi-functional art out of ironwood from the Sonoran Dessert for more than 40 years. This wood is extremely dense, so I have adapted tools and created techniques that allow me to shape the wood like stone. I most often create boxes, bowls, vases, bears, and wall hangings. I embellish each piece with inlays of sterling silver, turquoise, and / or other semi-precious gemstones, using motifs drawn from nature and spirituality. There is no finish on the wood, the variations in the grain in my completed pieces are a result of repeated sandings.

I derive my greatest satisfaction as an artist from the sheer joy of doing – of being at one with the wood and releasing the beauty that is within. I love the challenge of looking at and listening to a piece of wood and letting it reveal to me what it should become.

I have a tremendous sense of inner peace about my life and my work, and hope that those who touch the pieces of art I have created can feel this in the work itself.

Larry Favorite's artwork has appeared in several publications:



### TWA GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING—DECEMBER 3, 2019

### TOYS FOR TOTS DINNER

(meeting minutes: James Sapp)

The Triangle Workers Association conducted its regular business meeting at St. Michael's Catholic Church in Cary with the year-end culmination of the annual Toys for Tots program. The meeting included a potluck dinner. The featured speaker, as in years past, was Roy Underhill. Also attending were Marine Corps members Sgt. Reinhold and Sgt. Anguilar. Hil Peel of the Hardwood Store in Gibsonville, NC also was present. The Hardwood Store donated much of the wood supplies for the Toys for Tots program.

Roy Brookhart opened the meeting with a brief introduction of the program and honored guests prior to the potluck dinner. Bob Andrews offered grace prior to the dinner.

Fred Ford emceed the Toys for Tots program. He began by thanking Hil Peel and the Hardwood Store for their generous donation of wood to the program. Then, Sgt. Reinhold of the Marine Corps recounted some of the Toys for Tots program history saying it started in 1947 thanks to the wife of the commandant of the Marine Corps. Last year the Marine Corps distributed over 50,000 toys to 35,000 kids in the area. There are 8 active marines involved in the program. The program covers six counties with a population of 1.5 to 2 million people. At the end of the brief historical summary, Sgt.

Reinhold presented a plaque to the TWA for 25 years of support to the Toys for Tots program. Roy Brookhart accepted the plaque on behalf of the association.

Roy Underhill expressed his appreciation for the contributions of the Toys for Tots workers and how they were not only giving the children great joy but also a sense of what could be made from wood, and perhaps, laying the foundation for future woodworkers. Roy continued with an anecdotal story of a Mr. Sims who was a restoration craftsman at Colonial Williamsburg. The story traced back to Brighton,

England where Mr. Sims learned the valuable lesson from an old craftsman who lent his experience, tools and life lessons in a most subtle manner. The story related to the Toys for Tots workers, who by the contributions, where giving wonderful examples to future

generations.

Fred Ford then introduced the Toys for Tots team members, who, in turn, presented the toys, their fellow team members and the number of toys made. A list of the presenters and toys produced is on the next page.

On a particularly poignant moment in the presentation, Fred read a letter that Judy Sanwald sent to the Toys for Tots team for all their hard work on this year's toys. She recognized Bob Andrews, Barton Meeks, Hugh and Pat Fish, Dick Paur, Mike Weinberger, Mohan Sankor, and Dick Raup, who cheerfully finished the job just in time. She said Roger loved working with them, and their efforts in the past few weeks allowed him to feel that this year's toys would, indeed, be ready for delivery. Judy said she was so grateful and fortunate to work with this group. Fred acknowledged that Judy had sent a card of appreciation for the flowers sent by TWA upon Roger's passing.

This year's meeting was a great success celebrated with joy but with a sense of melancholy remembering the loss of our long-time member, Roger Sanwald.

### FINAL TOYS FOR TOTS REPORT FOR 2019, OUR 34TH YEAR

This year we have donated 4,265 toys! For the first time we have gone over 4,000 toys, beating our previous record of 3462 in 2011.

Forty-five of us attended the celebratory December Pot Luck Dinner, where we were entertained by our good friend Roy Underhill.

Our 34th year proved to be a great year. We had fifteen workshops, up from fourteen last year.

Fifty-two members participated in the workshops. Appropriately, most of the recognition and attention to our achievements goes to them. We recognized their efforts at our annual dinner by asking our hosts to demonstrate their toys and give highlights of their activities.

There are, however, several members who worked to make the program run smoothly. I am that sure most of you realize the importance of these contributors, but allow me to give them due credit.

Bob Andrews, also a workshop host, orders and supplies all of the parts (wheels, dowels etc.) requested by the other workshop hosts. He was also instrumental in securing a place, at no charge, for our December Social. He then coordinated the set up, the clean up, and more. THANKS, BOB! Terry Tenhouse, also a workshop host, secured all the wood requested by workshop hosts. Terry also acts as our interface to The Hardwood Store, our principal supplier of wood. THANKS, TERRY!

Joe Sabo, also a workshop host which made 817 toys, hosted the Klingspor "Meet the Public" day which entailed much preliminary work to make it possible to make 832 toys with 19 workers in less than seven hours. THANKS JOE!

I need to thank Hil Peel of The Hardwood Store of North Carolina for his generous contributions of hardwood. About 90% of the hardwood we used came from The Hardwood Store.

Thank you all for your support. I hope you all will take a moment on Christmas to think of all the children we helped have a Merry Christmas.
