

WOODWORKING, COLLABORATION AND INNOVATION RICHARD STEPHENSON AND ALICE HINMAN

Mark Firley introduced the featured speaker, Richard Stephenson of Raleigh's Flitch Furniture (https:// flitchfurniture.com). Flitch Furniture is a Raleigh based company making modular plywood furniture using a 'pressure-fit', no fastener, system of assembly. The origin of Flitch comes from Whitaker Mills Works, who provides the facilities and personnel to Flitch. Whitaker Mills designs and fabricates custom cabinetry and furniture with durable, fine quality wood products for contemporary living and working environments. They are located on

Fayetteville Road, south of Tryon Road, near the Lowe's Home Improvement store in Garner.

Flitch furniture offerings include modular storage, stools and plant stands. Flitch constructs these with high quality, CARB-2 certified multi-core plywood with a maple veneer and finishes them in the shop with a HAP and formaldehyde free clear finishes. Laminated products are made with low chemical emission, Greenguard Gold certified high pressure laminate. The CNC machine can cut on three axes and accommodate 12-foot panels.

Cutting tolerances are very exact, allowing their furniture pieces to be assembled by pressure fit without the aid of fasteners.

In the spring of 2019 Flitch held a workshop for children teaching hands-on skill development and wildlife



stewardship, building bluebird houses. The event was posted on social media for everyone to enjoy. One of the people who enjoyed it the most, and who saw potential in the production concept was Alice Hinman of 'Apiopolis' (https:// www.apiopolis.org), a nonprofit organization in Raleigh promoting bee sustainability through healthy bee habitats. After playing a short video clip regarding the work that Apiopolis does, Ms. Hinman was present to answer questions about her work and the novel approach she is using with Flitch Furniture to build a better bee habitat.
