
Workshop

# WILLIAM CUMMINGS' TOOLS CIRCA 1868—ROY UNDERHILL

Mark Firley introduced the featured speaker, Roy Underhill, who spoke about house joiner William Cummings. In January 1868, William Cummings began work on the Robert E. Lee house in Lexington, VA. This work was multifaceted and included laying flooring, making moldings, doors, windows, railings, stairs and many of the details incorporated into the house. At the meeting Roy shared with the members many pictures of the tools used by Mr. Cummings and excerpts from pages from Mr. Cummings' diary that

documented work performed, materials used and tools obtained in the construction of the house at Washington and Lee University in Lexington, Virginia. The pages of the diary that Roy presented gave us an insight into the life of this Virginia house joiner. For those who have further interest, Mr. Cummings' tools may be viewed and examined at Roy's Woodwright's School in Pittsboro, North Carolina. Roy also can make available digital reproductions of the pages from the diary.

Cara has been whittling and working with wood for many years, having developed an interest in woodworking when she was a child. She fondly remembers a "jolly old carpenter named Bobby Carpenter who wore overalls and played the fiddle" as her earliest influence.

Cara was the first woman to become a certified Journeyman Carpenter in Northern Virginia in the 1980's. She started whittling spoons, animal shapes and canes while in Pennsylvania working with an Amish crew renovating an old farmhouse. After taking a class with Barron at the Piedmont Earth Skills Gathering at Shakori Hills last spring, she picked it back up and has turned her attention to Swedish carving techniques, learning from Peter Follansbee. I am glad to report that with the help of Joe Sabo we were able to distribute all of the wood to TWA Toys for Tots Workshop Hosts to be used in toy construction.

The TWA Toys for Tots program is moving right along. As Joe and I were working to get the wood distributed, we discussed his workshop and he said that Bruce Wrenn was going to be receiving the wood to start cutting out the Volkswagen blanks for the plates for the workshop.

Joe and I discussed the likelihood that we will be unable to have a Toys forTots Workshop in the Klingspor Store. Joe is working on an alternative and is determined to turn out the 900 Volkswagens.

Sadly this year I am unable to attend workshops because of the corona pandemic. Most, if not all, of the workshops are being conducted in individual workshops. So far we have a pretty good sign up for toys to be made this year. I would like a few more so we can break the 4000 toy goal but it's going to be very difficult this year.
