
Topic: Boxes

The Board recognizes that there are many things to work out before we can restart our face -to-face meetings. ## TOYS FOR TOTS KICK-OFF MEETING—TOYS AND JIGS

At the June meeting, Fred Ford introduced the Toys for Tots program for 2021. In the June TWA

Newsletter, Fred presented the workshop chairpersons, their crew volunteers and their toys projects.

There are 13 workshops plus the Klingspor VW workshop held in December that will turn out an estimate 4000+ toys this year by latest count. The chairpersons attending the meeting, provided samples of the toy offerings for this

year. Additionally, the workshop chairs showed and demonstrated some of the jigs used in making toys as well as for regular woodworking tasks. The Zoom presentation was recorded and will be available on the TWA website in the new future.

Fred announced that Les Hall will be making a wood run to the Hardwood Store for TFT wood supplies. Workshop chairs are encouraged to get their wood supply needs to Les as soon as possible. Bob Andrews said he will be ordering wheels, axles, etc., so he will need to know workgroup needs soon. Roy Brookhart recently visited the Hardwood Store and noted that the store is overflowing with wood cutoffs or shorts and needs help in moving them out of the store. Workshop chairs and/or teams are encouraged to visit the store and pick-up these materials if they can use them for their toy projects.

Don was a long-term member of the TWA as well as a major contributor to the Toys for Tots program. Don had a lot of friends in the club and we will all miss him very much.

In addition to the toys, Dorothy also donated a lot of toy-making parts, including various sizes of wheels and other miscellaneous parts. Cecil Raynor has taken charge of the distribution of these items. He will give the toys to the Marine Corps when they open for business this year and he is giving the other parts to Bob Andrews. Bob will sort through the parts and keep them in his inventory until there is a demand. He will hold the other parts until our first in-person TWA meeting, where we will be having a big auction of all donations collected during the Covid year. These parts will be a part of that auction.

The workshops are off to a good start this year, with Joe Sabo's workshop starting in 2000 and most of the other workshops now showing some activity.

We had a call from Cheryl Lewis of the Hardwood Store to tell us that their short cuts bin was overflowing. Cheryl invited us to take what we needed from the large assortment of wood species. #### **UPCOMING MEETING**

**Meeting Topic**: Flat Straight & Square –

Milling Stock

**Speaker**: Bob Van Dyke

Date: Tuesday, August 17

Bob Van Dyke operates the Connecticut Valley School of Woodworking in Manchester, CT. The school offers a variety of classes taught by himself and by many of today's top woodworking instructors. Bob is also a Contributing Editor for Fine Woodworking Magazine and he has done many videos for www.finewoodworking.com.

If you don't start out with stock that is flat, straight and square then it is just about impossible to cut anything resembling an accurate furniture joint. The problem is that solid wood does not come that way- and even if it is straight today there is a good chance it will not be tomorrow. Bob will demonstrate how the jointer, thickness planer and tablesaw work together to make an effective system for milling wood flat straight and square. These are the three fundamental machines in the workshop and their proper and safe operation is essential to any successful woodworking endeavor.

Particular emphasis will be placed on the tablesaw as this is the most common and probably the most misunderstood machine in the shop. Bob will go on to demonstrate some smoothing techniques to get rid of the machine marks and any tearout. Your woodworking will benefit immeasurably and your confidence will grow by leaps and bounds.
