

TOYS FOR TOTS STATUS REPORT

Let me tell you the good news about our budget. Fiscal year ending in June 2020 we had a budget of \$1,500 and we receive donations in the amount of \$1,581. This result is due to the generosity of many of our members. I am aware of quite a few donations and purchased parts were not charged to the treasury. Thank you to all of you, known and unknown, that contributed to this success.

There were 51 TWA members and 11 non-members who participated this year. Some worked in more than one workshop. There were a total of 14 workshops. As shown in the table, this will be the fourth year in a row that we have exceeded 4000 toys.

We will meet in Klingspor on December 14 with in person attendance and also a ZOOM transmission. The program will be presented by the Workshop Hosts. Hosts will bring samples of the toys they have produced, recognize their workshop members and tell us about how the workshop was conducted. You may see some interesting jigs and hear about planning the construction process.

It seems like forever since we had our last face-toface meeting. I am really looking forward to seeing all of you and hope we have a good turnout.

The picture shown will hopefully generate interest in seeing the product in person. If you take this apart at the meeting you will be responsible for putting it back together. You may have to take it home with you because I understand that it's not easy to reassemble.

TWA GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING—NOVEMBER 16, 2021

Roy Brookhart opened the meeting conducted using Zoom virtual technology. There were 25 people in attendance.

Good news! Klingspor has installed the necessary equipment to permit guest user WiFi, that will, hopefully allow TWA to resume face-to-face meetings while using Zoom for those who cannot attend in-person. Roy Brookhart and Chris Gebhardt will be testing the system and providing information to members through the TWA webmaster regarding the December meeting. Other meeting details such as membership dues and name tags,

refreshments, AV needs and room set-up will need to be reestablished.

Please note that the next meeting will be on Tuesday December 14th at 7:00PM. The tentative plan is to have the meeting in-person at Klingspor presuming successful testing of Wi-Fi system at Klingspor. The timing of the meeting is one week earlier than the usual 3rd Tuesday of the month. The focus of the meeting will be yearly wrap-up for Toys for Tots with a presentation of the toys made this year by the workshops. Stay tuned to the emails from the webmaster regarding details about

Toys for Tots crew leaders continue to make progress towards the December toy completion goals and transfer to the Marine Corps. Eighteen workshops are expecting to produce 4000+ toys this year. TRADITIONAL WOODCARVING — MARY MAY

(meeting minutes: James Sapp)

At the November meeting, Mary May presented on traditional woodcarving.

From her studio in Charleston, South Carolina, Mary started by sharing a bit of her background in carving. Born in Minnesota, she was inspired by the wood carvings in European churches, palaces, and museums. This led her to find all she could about carving through books, exhibits and eventually through a teacher. In Minnesota she learned under Konstantinos Papadakis, a master carver for Greek Orthodox churches throughout the United States. After gaining experience she travelled to England to study

and learn more about carving. She started teaching carving about 15 years ago. She also has on-line carving classes on her website:

www.marymaycarving.com/carvingschool.

Mary focuses mainly on carving antique furniture reproductions and traditional architectural decorations. She has written several articles for Popular Woodworking magazine and The Society of American Period Furniture Makers yearly journal and teaches workshops at a variety of locations throughout the United States and Europe. Mary has been a guest on "The

Woodwright's Shop" with Roy Underhill four times. She recently published her first book on Carving the Acanthus Leaf. One of Mary's recent experiences was a ten-day visit to London to view and learn about carving masterpieces of Grinling Gibbons, a world-renowned carver of the 17th Century whose works exists in many famous British sites, including St. Paul's Cathedral, Hampton Court Palace, and Windsor Palace to name a few. For those interested in learning more, Mary recommends reading the book, Grinling Gibbons and the Art of Carving by David Esterly.

TRADITIONAL WOODCARVING — MARY MAY (CONTINUED)

Mary then discussed her equipment, including carving tools, fingerless gloves and medical tape, and workbench holding. She covered her recommend woods for carving. Finally, she discussed the basic techniques of traditional woodcarving using long handled tools - how to hold the tools, how to stay safe with razor sharp gouges, and how to sharpen tools to get that razor edge. At the end of the program, Mary demonstrated how to carve a flower in shallow relief. showing how to trick the eye into seeing extra depth in a very shallow carving.

Some key points that Mary included in her presentation were:

- She prefers fingerless gloves
 with padding such as those
 used for cycling or weightlifting
 to ease stresses on her hands
 when using long handled
 gouges. She uses medical tape
 wrap on her fingers when
 whittling.
- She prefers mallets in the 1.3pound range, usually a combination of wood and brass.
- Favorite woods for carving are basswood and butternut because of their softness and ease of carving, especially

- helpful for beginning carvers.
 Mahogany (from Honduras)
 and walnut are harder but
 burnish nicely when carving. A
 heavier mallet is needed for
 carving these harder woods.
- Most of the time Mary holds her work pieces between bench dogs on her workbench. For smaller and more delicate pieces she uses double stick tape to adhere the piece to a backer board and then secures it on her bench.
- handled gouges and has many of them. She prefers fish-tail style gouges for the ease of getting into tight spaces and to allow her to see better what she is carving. Tool makers include Swiss Made (Pfeil), Auriou, Dastra, Hirsch, and Two Cherries. She uses www.chippingaway.com as one of her key sources for her tools. Their website includes Mary's recommended set of gouges for beginning carvers.
- Gouges are classified by two numbers designating their curvature (sweep) and width (millimeters). Sweeps range from #1 (flat) to #11 (u-

- shaped). Mary's recommended gouges for beginning carvers are #3/6mm, #3/14mm, #5/6mm, #5/14mm, #7/6mm, #7/14mm, and 6mm 60° V-chisel. An "F" designation on the gouge indicates that it a fish-tail version.
- Mary sharpens her gouges by hand on 1200 and 8000 grit diamond stones followed by stropping on leather and green rouge.

To complete the presentation Mary carved a calla lily relief on basswood. Before starting to carve, she emphasized that close attention needs to be paid to grain direction to prevent tear-out and ugly results. Mary showed a wooden donut relief carving that she uses in her classes to teach proper carving with respect to grain direction.
