
Join us in October as Bob and Jean show us some of their recent projects. These are all pieces of furniture and will cause you to think about how you can use some of these techniques in your own projects.

SEPTEMBER FEATURED SPEAKERS - CHRIS SMITH AND MIKE PAYST

(meeting minutes: James Sapp)

The September meeting presentations were given by Chris Smith and Mike Payst. The presentations were recorded and will be available in the members-only section of the TWA website.

Kerry Schoolfield, from the TWA Program Committee, introduced Chris Smith, an employee of Klingspor's, out of Hickory, who provides technical support and help to customers. Chris' presentation reviewed Microjig products and how he uses them in his own woodworking shop. Chris started the presentation with the GRR-RIPPER pushblock highlighting its safety and accuracy benefits on the table saw. Responding to an audience question about cleaning the rubber feet of the GRR-RIPPER, Chris said he finds Simple Green works effectively to clean the feet. Chris introduced a new Microjig product called FITFINDER 1/2 Gauge. This new device helps achieve perfect fitting half-lap joints by finding the exact half thickness of the board being milled for the joint.

The majority of Chris's presentation centered around how he uses MATCHFIT clamps and hardware to make jigs. The clamps and hardware fit a 14° dovetail slot. Microjig sells a special 14° dovetail bit that not only cuts the dovetail but also rounds the

edges in one operation. He has found this bit to be better for routing the slot for the MATCHFIT products. He showed a simple MDF board with dovetail grooves cut down the length and cross wise. He uses this with MATCHFIT clamps to position the board as an edge guide for routers and circular saws. He also uses it as a tapering jig for the table saw. Chris went on to show his cross-cut sled for the table saw. His version has multiple dovetail grooves for attaching stops and clamps to the base and fence. He has built specialty jigs that utilize the MATCHFIT system including a miter and a tenoning jig. Be sure to visit his You-Tube site, Christ Cross Crafts to see how he built them.

The second half of the program was presented by long-time TWA member Mike Payst (aka "man of many vises"). Mike brought three



different style vises he has made and uses in his shop. The first vise was, for the lack of a better term, a small version of a Moxon vise. The Acme threaded rods came from the ends of a Walmart dumbbell set. A unique feature of Mike's vise is that the rods extend out the back of the vise. This style of vise is used with hand cutting dovetails. The second vise Mike presented was a portable version of the leg vise similar to what Benchcrafted sells as Hi-Vise. Mike's vise includes the criss-cross device to keep faces aligned properly. The third vise was a shoulder vise, which Mike is experimenting with. Mike added a feature to keep the chop aligned when securing objects not centered on the vise screw mechanism. Mike indicated that of all the vises he presented, the Hi-Vise is the one he uses the most.
