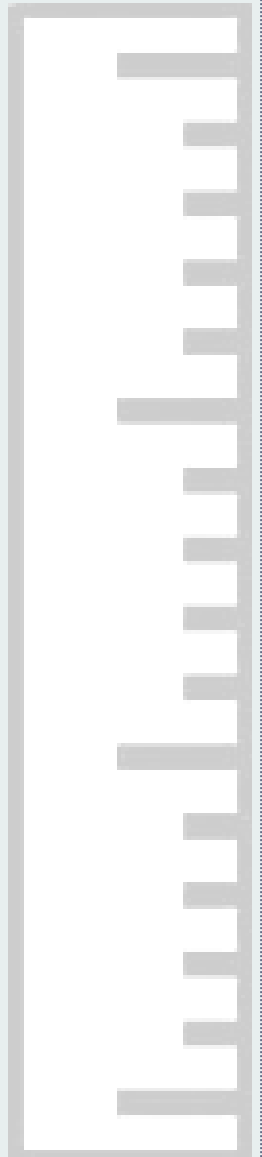

OCTOBER FEATURED SPEAKERS - BOB GABOR, JEAN THOMAS AND JOE SABO

(meeting minutes: James Sapp)

The October meeting presentations were given by Bob Gabor, Jean Thomas and Joe Sabo. The presentations were recorded and will be available in the members-only section of the TWA website.

Bob and Jean provided a superb review of recent furniture projects they have made. These projects were replacement items having quite a unique modern flair. Bob explained that for each project he makes a scale model, a full-size drawing, a prototype out of construction lumber and finally the finished project. When finished Bob and Jean do not keep the drawings or scale models. Many parts of the projects were typically made out of Baltic Birch plywood that is veneered with figured and exotic hardwoods.

The first project was a round dining table. The top was thick tempered glass supported with curved legs connected in a unique manner to a wooden sub top. A lower shelf is support by the legs as well using dowels. When finished, Jean used the prototype to fashion an occasional table, similar to the dining table. Jean painted the prototype with lamp black milk paint.

The second project was a fantastic headboard for the master bedroom. The bed, which is located in the middle of the room, required the headboard to be presentable from both the front and back directions. Their design incorporated a large sweeping arch, horizontal cherry boards mortised into the arch and a wooden bow design applied to the cherry boards and arch. The arch was veneered with wenge and the bow with lace wood. Jean did the veneering, a skill that she learned and became proficient on these projects.

The third project was a sofa table. The table top was made from a macacauba slab. One leg of the table was made using a waterfall joint out of the slab. The opposing leg was a uniquely design curved leg that was attached to the top and painted with lamp black milk paint.

The fourth project was a table for the foyer. The table top is 1/2 inch tempered glass supported by a curved stand. It is hard to describe the stand in words, suffice to say it almost resembled the flattened digit 2. They constructed the stand out of Baltic Birch plywood veneered with pau ferro. The interior was filled with

bendy mahogany plywood. I highly recommend viewing Bob and Jean's presentation to get the full appreciation of the outstanding craftsmanship and inventiveness of the designs.

At the meeting, Jean and Bob also displayed craft items, such as charcuterie boards, vases, cutting boards and cell phone holders. They will be selling these at a craft show in Chatham county in November.

Joe Sabo took us through the journey of making an art studio center for a friend. The art studio center is centered around the use of air brushing tools. The center incorporated paint, templates and material storage. The center includes facilities for the air brush compressor, electrical controls for the equipment and ducting and exhaust blowers. The center was built with birch plywood and poplar. Joe has 168 hours in the project while his client has several more hours involved with finishing and drilling holes for the paint shelves. Be sure to see this interesting project on the website.
