

TWA GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING—APRIL 18, 2023

(meeting minutes: James Sapp)

Roy Brookhart opened the regular monthly meeting at Klingspor's Woodworking shop in Cary, NC and on Zoom.

Approximately 25 attended in person with another 10 on Zoom.

There were no guests or new members attending.

Two full-term (three year) board positions will open in September. Any member interested in serving on the board should let us know. Additionally, as per our by-laws, a board nominating committee will be forming in May or June. Anyone interested in serving on the committee should contact Roy or any other board members. The nominating committee will recommend new board candidates for the September election.

Following up his article in the April newsletter, Roy asked for a show of interest regarding the idea to hold auctions for tools and materials that members might want to donate to raise money for the club. Also, Roy floated the idea of having a "garage sale" event held at some location to be determined or possibly at Klingspor if arrangements could be made. Funds derived from these activities would go to support the Toys for Tots program and/or the club. Overall, the consensus of those attending was favorable toward pursuing these ideas.

Barton Meeks and Paul
Holzworth (aka the Webmaster)
are keeping it current.

Bob Gabor is arranging for the sale of Terry Tenhouse's shop tools and materials. He has already made arrangements for the machinery and power tools. However, there are many hand tools and materials that will need to find homes. Bob will be providing more details in the near future through the TWA Webmaster.

Bob Andrews indicated that the June TWA meeting (scheduled for June 20th) will be held at the Atria Senior Center in Raleigh. This is the same location that was used last December for the Toys for Tots Christmas function. The meeting will commence at 6:30 PM with hors d'oeuvres followed by the meeting at 7:00 PM. The workshop's hosts will highlight their plans for toymaking this year. Bob will lead a discussion of techniques used in making toys to encourage a dialog about alternative methods for building toys.

APRIL FEATURED PRESENTATIONS - JIGS, FIXTURES AND SHOP TIPS

(meeting minutes: James Sapp)

The April meeting presentations were given by club members. Bob Gabor, was the host. TWA members presenting woodworking jigs included Bob Andrews, Roy Brookhart, Bob Gabor, Barton Meeks, Mike Payst, Michael Peele, and Jim Sapp. The presentation of the jigs was recorded and is available on the TWA website.

Bob Andrews presented a unique thin rip guide for the table saw that cuts thin strips on the inside face of the blade, allowing the rip fence to stay in place when making multiple strips.

Roy Brookhart took us through his search for the ultimate table saw blade height jig. Once he establishes where top dead center

of the blade is at zero, he uses a stick attached to the side of the blade with a magnet to calibrate a saw height gauge to zero and then raise the blade to the desired cutting height.

Bob Gabor presented the drilling jig he and Jean Thomas use to drill a 2" hole at a specific angle to make their unique wine bottle holder.

Barton Meeks provided us with several jig ideas including a shooting board, a sharpening jig used in combination with the drill press chisel sharpening system sold through Taylor Toolworks (taytools.com), a simple table saw in-feed support featured by Jay Bates on You-Tube, and a workbench support jig for planing long wood pieces.

Mike Payst provided us with the improvements he made to his Woodriver drill press fence and his drill press table.

Michael Peele presented an ingenious box used to collect small parts for the Toys for Toys Connect Four game. The device uses the vacuum of the dust collector to recover the parts into

the box as they are cut on the table saw. A screen inside the box keeps the parts from going to the dust collector.

Jim Sapp showed a band saw circle cutting jig and three table saw jigs. One of the table saw jigs, featured in Fine Woodworking Magazine, is used to cut picture frames sized to match the mat and backing sizes using the rabbet inside the frame as the reference. The second was Jim's rendition of Bob Van Dyke's L-fence, also from Fine Woodworking magazine, using Micro-Jig dovetail clamps to secure it to the table saw fence. The third jig was a taper cutting jig that he adapted from Brad Rodriguez (Fix This, Build That on You-Tube).
