TWA GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING–JUNE 20, 2023

(meeting minutes: James Sapp)

The meeting started with hors d'oeuvres at the Atria Senior Center in Raleigh for those attending in person. Following that, the regular meeting started for attendees and Zoom folks. Guests attending included spouses Linda Sapp, Linda Meeks, Aileen Andrews, and Diane Mills, and Jim Nelson, father of Shirley Troyer. This meeting marked the official start of the 2023 Toys for Tots campaign. Even so, many toys have already been made, prompting Bob Andrews to suggest we consider renaming this event to something more fitting.

Roy reminded those attending that the regular first Tuesday of the month WW and W meeting will not occur in July because it falls on Independence Day.

Bob Andrews served as master of ceremonies for the succeeding presentation by Toys for Tots workshop leaders.

Joe Sabo shared that this year's program includes 14 workshops and three new workshop leaders: Ray Essington, Shirley Troyer and Jonathan Sapp. Joe remarked that the Hardwood Store continues to generously supply our program with wood free of charge. Joe also noted working through Bill Ramsey at Truswood of Raleigh, workshops may obtain 2x cut-offs free of charge for their workshops. They are located at 8813 Running Oak Dr., Raleigh, NC 27617. For materials such as wheels, axles, balls, etc. workshops should order this through Bob Andrews, who is the procurement manager for Toys for Tots. New to the program this year, we have been able to have outside groups participate by assembling toys. So far, the Atria Senior Center in Raleigh has successfully assembled toy helicopters with materials and instructions supplied by Joe. Chris Gebhardt has arranged for employees at his employer, NetApp, to help assemble toys generated at the December Klingspor's Toys for Tots workshop.

Workshop hosts then discussed their plans for this year.

- Roy Brookhart, whose workshop is known as Terry Tenhouse's workshop, will be making about 150 toys consisting of knickknack boxes of various shapes and another toy yet to be determined. This workshop will also be completing toys from Mark Firley's workshop inventory that could not be made due to Mark's untimely passing.
- Don Klemp's workshop is making a climbing bear toy and a knock hockey table inspired by his youth memories in New York.
- Judy Sanwald and Bob Andrews will be making wooden puzzles, walking duck toys, book ends complete with a few children's books, city blocks, and three letter spelling games for youngsters. If any members have children's books that they can donate, these will be included with the book ends presents.
- Bob Andrews is making Corvette model cars. He is currently working on the prototype.
- Cecil Raynor's workshop is producing about 150 walnut/ maple flatbed trucks.
- Ray Essington is now the leader of what was formerly Bob Gabor's workshop. Sorry, Bob's shop didn't come with the job! The workshop is making art supply boxes, Barbie Doll beds, and pyramid puzzles.
- Joe Sabo's workshop group is making race cars, dragsters, tanks, helicopters, trucks and boxes. Joe will be leading the
