
Topics: (1) Beads of Courage and (2) Turntables

TWA GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING—SEPTEMBER 19, 2023

The September meeting was held at Klingspor's Woodworking Shop in Cary and on Zoom.

Approximately, twenty-six people were present with seven more on Zoom. Bryan Connelly was our featured speaker and guest. Guests attending were Charley Stickney, Rick Connelly (Bryan's father) and Ann and John Thomas.

Roy asked the audience if they ever use the mentor list shown on the website and in the newsletter. He also asked them if they knew what a mentor was. Almost all had seen the list, but few, if any, had contacted mentors for help. Noting that the mentor list is out of date and needs to be revised or discontinued, input from the audience indicated that we should continue to have a mentor list specifically as an aid in attracting new members to the club. Roy then asked all to review the list and consider becoming a mentor. Those interested in serving as mentors should contact Roy or any other board member.

As September is the start of the new fiscal year for TWA, Roy announced that Kerry Schoolfield has been named as the club vice-president. This role includes chairing of the program committee, a vital function for sustaining and growing the club. Thank you, Kerry for accepting

this key position in the club.

Rockler Woodworking will be opening a new store in the Crossroads shopping area this fall. Roy has visited the store and spoken with Rockler personnel. They are excited to have a connection with TWA. Rockler is currently hiring personnel for their store opening.

Joe Sabo called to our attention that Cary Magazine and Triangle Family Magazine will be featuring articles about TWA and the Toys for Tots program in forthcoming issues slated for November/ December of this year. These articles will hopefully bring more community awareness to our club and perhaps aid in attracting new members.

We hope to attract new members though this program, as well as to receive monetary contributions.

Barton Meeks announced that we will be holding the final membership raffle this fall. We will continue to offer one year's free membership dues for members who bring in three new members during the year.

SEPTEMBER FEATURED PRESENTATION - RIVER TABLES

Bob Gabor introduced Bryan
Connelly, the featured speaker for
the September meeting. Bryan
presented his methods for
producing live edge river tables.
Bryan had been exposed to
woodworking early in life by his
father who was a carpenter, had a
woodworking shop as a hobby and
built the family home in Hickory.
All family members were enlisted to
help. Bryan spent 8 years part-time
restoring a sailboat and learned a
lot about epoxies, fiberglass, and
gel coats.

Bryan had video presentations lined up for the meeting. Interspersed with the videos Brian gave us some key points in working with epoxy and answered many questions raised by the audience. The presentation was video recorded and will be on the TWA website. Bryan's videos are available on YouTube. Search for Brilliant Custom, Inc. on YouTube and go to the Playlist tab to see the videos he used.

Bryan started the presentation by discussing his building techniques for the molds that will hold the

wood and epoxy slabs. Using MDF or Melamine base and wood sides, he showed us how he builds the molds with particular emphasis on how he seals the mold with tape, caulk and molding clays. He stressed that epoxy will find its way to leak out of the mold or into parts of the table where epoxy is not desired unless very careful attention is paid to sealing the mold. The brand of sealing and release tape he uses is described in the first video, Building the Mold. Next up was pouring the epoxy starting with a base coat about 1/8" to 1/4" thick followed by a deep pour to final thickness. The starting pour is a thick epoxy like those that would be used in coating surfaces. This pour further helps seal the mold and where the wood contacts the mold. The deep pour is a thin epoxy formulated for this application. Dyes and dispersions such as mica are added to the epoxy before pouring. He reviewed how he removes bubbles from the epoxy by using a MAPP gas torch. He discussed adding fillers such as mica and showed how to mix them

during the epoxy pours. Bryan has found that keeping his room at 70°F or lower greatly helps control the epoxy temperature. Bryan showed a video of flattening the slab using a router sled moving down the length of the slab. The final stage is finishing where Bryan progresses up through finer and finer sandpaper grits and then to polishing compounds and buffing. Be sure to watch the TWA presentation to catch all of the tips and questions that were addressed at the meeting.

Date: Tuesday, November 21 **Topic**: Building a Spice Box

Speaker: Jim Creasman

Jim's day job as a software architect pays the bills. However, as the son of a carpenter, he's always been involved with woodworking in some form or fashion. That is really where his heart is. Several years ago, he became more interested in acquiring, understanding, and using traditional tools and techniques, especially as these relate to making period furniture. Each new project became a journey of discovery with lots of paths to explore, frequently leading to improved skills and new tools.

Jim's presentation will be about a recent woodworking journey, building a William & Mary Spice Box. Spice boxes offer a wealth of challenging exercises to the woodworker, equal in complexity to any full-size cabinetry one might build. While the subject of the presentation is the spice box, he will spend most of the time discussing the hand tools and techniques used. Many of the tools are ones he's made and range from the arcane to commonplace.
