Topic: Rockler's New Store in Cary





TWA GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING—DECEMBER 12, 2023

ANNUAL TOYS FOR TOTS DINNER

(meeting minutes: James Sapp)

The annual Christmas and Toys for Tots celebration convened at the Atria Senior Center in Raleigh. Twenty people attended plus two special guests, Major David Liu and Sergeant Ryan Morales, from the Marine Corps. Ms. Jess Tougeron, representing Atria, served as hostess of the event. Many of the toys made by the workshops were on display at the meeting. This was an in-person event only with no Zoom coverage.

Before the presentation started, the staff at Atria Senior Center served a delicious meal to all attending. Thanks go to Jess and the folks at Atria for their hospitality and great food.

Roy welcomed and thanked all who came to the event. He highlighted three recent Triangle area magazines that had articles about TWA and the Toys for Tots program. Roy also noted interest by Spectrum about doing a feature about TWA making toys. Joe Sabo said that the write-ups for the magazines were initiated by a press release prepared by one of Joe's classmates, who happened to be living in the Triangle.

Cecil Raynor informed the attendees that past TWA member, Bernie Bogdon, had passed away Friday, December 8. He encouraged members to consider donating in Bernie's name to Toys for Tots. Donations can be made

To start off the Toys for Tots Presentation, Joe Sabo introduced Maj. David Liu and Sgt. Ryan Morales. Maj. Liu shared a couple of touching stories of how the Toys for Tots program has made a lasting impression on him. One of those was about a lady who contacted the Marines to donate her entire extensive Barbie Doll collection to the Toys for Tots program. The other story that touched Maj. Liu deeply was the dedication, workmanship, and effort of those associated with the TWA Toys for Tots program. This program generously delivers a large amount of quality toys every year. This year the Marines will provide toys to over 78,000 deserving children.

Joe announced that this year the TWA Toys for Tots program has delivered 5778 toys, making it about 7% of the total number the Marines will provide. Included in the total is 1024 toys made at the December Klingspor's toy building event. Joe noted that this year many of the toys made at Klingspor's were finished by employees of NetApp. Chris Gebhardt, who works at NetApp, arranged for this cooperative venture through NetApp's giving back program. NetApp pays the employee volunteers for their efforts, with the expectation that

the employees donate the money earned during their charity efforts to a charity of their choice. Net App matches their donations.

In addition to the contributions made by NetApp, the folks at the Atria Senior Center helped by completing helicopters provided by Joe Sabo. They also helped Judy Sanwald by stenciling the city block forms made in her workshop.

Joe indicated that because the Marines would like to receive the toys earlier to assist in their boxing and distribution, we will be moving the Klingspor's event two weeks earlier by having it on the Saturday before Thanksgiving.

Roy Brookhart's workshop, in addition making their planned toys, also completed toys that late TWA member Mark Firley was making. Cecil Raynor emphasized that the toy trucks his workshop made were first designed and made by Bernie Bogdon. Don Klemp's workshop produced a hockey game that resembled one that he played as a kid in New York.

This next meeting will be held at the new Rockler Store in Cary and will be an opportunity for Rockler to introduce the store to the club. The meeting will be formatted like the meeting held earlier in 2023 at Woodcraft, Rockler is quite enthusiastic about developing a relationship with TWA so attendance is encouraged by all. Also, on December 16th from 11 AM to 3 PM Rockler had invited TWA to set a place in their store so that they can introduce their customers to our organization. Roy Brookhart handled the details.
